### Mr. Moreau- Music Technology



General Art classes are finishing the school year with an Independent Assignment. They had to develop a plan and lay out three different projects. They are choosing supplies based on what supplies they have used this year. 7th Grade Art finished their Candy Compositions and moved into Deconstructed Collages. They will finish up the school year with Painting utilizing Paper Collage and an Independent Art Lesson choosing from what they have learned this year. 8th Grade Art finished up Micrography (the art of drawing visual patterns from lines of minutely written words, which is a Jewish art form). They are currently working on a 3 Medium Artwork which will have two different papers and use ink, charcoal and colored pencils for the drawing portion. They will finish up with a Printmaking Lesson as well.
