### Academic Excellence



ur greatest goal is to instill a lifelong love of learning. Rooted in a robust, well-rounded curriculum, we challenge our students to develop problem-solving and critical thinking skills in a high-performing, college-preparatory environment. The strategic plan focuses on key areas, including STEAM, foreign language, and technology integration to cultivate the proficiencies needed to compete and succeed in a rapidly changing world.

#### **KEY POINTS INCLUDE:**

- Adding foreign language instruction for all lower school students.
- Adopting best practices at every level while determining key investments and instruction to aid technology integration.
- Full evaluation of all subject areas to ensure a balanced and updated curricula, with special emphasis on STEAM (science, technology, engineering, art and math).
- Enhancing vertical alignment across curricula with an emphasis on divisional transitions.

#### **FAST FACTS:**

- 100% college acceptance rate with 66% earning college credit at Pinewood.
- 13 Advanced Placement (AP) courses, as well as video production and digital arts classes.
- 15 years of teaching experience, on average.
- More than twice as many Master Teachers compared to other independent schools in South Carolina (16).
- 1:1 counseling to guide each student's post-graduation plan.



## Student Experience



o complement rigorous academics and cultivate a well-rounded student, Pinewood provides exceptional opportunities in the arts and athletics. The strategic plan seeks to strengthen both areas through key investments in facilities, personnel, and communications, while exposing students to more enrichment and college opportunities.

#### **KEY POINTS INCLUDE:**

- Setting a timeline for construction of a new theatre, art gallery, and athletic facility.
- Expanding the school's role in college recruitment for athletics, performing, and visual arts.
- Maintaining the highest professional standards and certification for all coaching staff, while growing the athletic training program and improving communication among studentathletes, parents, alumni, and community.
- Conducting a third-party expert review of the music, art, and drama curriculum from Pre-K3–12 to ensure effective integration and full mastery of skills.
- Creating greater exposure to college arts opportunities through school trips to galleries, productions, and art exhibits, while planning more outside adjudication of student performances.

#### **FAST FACTS:**

- More than 70% of students participate in both athletics and the arts.
- 34 athletic teams, from Middle School to Varsity (17 boys; 16 girls; 1 co-ed).
- 30 clubs and student organizations.
- Nationally and internationally recognized theatre program.
- Pre-K3-12 fine and performing arts curriculum.
- Only SCISA school with an artificial turf playing field (anticipated in spring 2022).



Pinewood Stage Company has represented the United States at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland, while more than 100 Pinewood graduates signed national letters of intent to play collegiate athletics in the past 20 years.

### Learning Environment



t Pinewood, people are our greatest asset—but we know our campus also plays a vital role in student success. That is why our strategic plan includes both short-term action and long-range planning for smart investments in our facilities. Given the rapid growth in our region, Pinewood's rich history and central location serve as a powerful symbol of Panther pride and community.

#### **KEY POINTS INCLUDE:**

- A five-year facility strategy, tracking the status of key systems and renovations in every building, allowing prioritized renovations while maintaining optimum use.
- Smaller projects like installing new sidewalks, delineating wetlands, and forming a beautification committee to deliver instant return on investment.
- Launching long-term goals, including a Capital Campaign to support construction of a new athletics and arts center.

#### **FAST FACTS:**

- Average class size:
   16 (Lower School); 17 (Middle School); 14 (High School).
- 9:1 student/teacher ratio in Lower School; 13:1 in Middle and Upper School.
- 43-acre campus includes Liberty Garden, an outdoor relaxation and gathering space.
- International students from 15 countries.
- Meals and snacks, chef-prepared daily at Coursey Café.

chool should be a safe haven. Now, more than ever, we are committed to providing a secure, healthy, and nurturing environment for everyone at Pinewood. Our strategic plan reflects this promise by adopting new technology, strengthening key relationships, and providing the training and education to support the physical and emotional well-being of our students, faculty, and staff.

#### **KEY POINTS INCLUDE:**

- Adopting full functionality and usage of the PunchAlert app for emergency notifications and crisis management.
- Investing in additional security cameras, proximity card readers, and crisis planning, while strengthening the campus perimeter with gates, fencing, signage, and lighting.
- Reaffirming Pinewood's commitment to child welfare and well-being, through rigorous annual abuse-prevention training and review of mental health staffing and resources.
- Continuing to strengthen relationships with local law enforcement, first responders, and mental health professionals.

- 100% in-person learning since the pandemic began.
- Two full-time time mental health counselors on campus, focusing exclusively on student well-being.
- The only private school in South Carolina with a full-time deputy on campus.
- 100% staff and faculty completion of rigorous annual training on abuse prevention and early detection.
- Security cameras throughout campus and sheriff's department participation in safety drills and crisis plans.

Pinewood is one of just a handful of schools across the country that has maintained in-person learning throughout the pandemic. Through careful planning and monitoring, our commitment to full-time, in-school instruction has provided students with a true, in-person experience, including cherished rites of passage like prom and a traditional graduation ceremony, with guests.

As we continue to grow—nearly seven decades after our founding—our strategic plan focuses on strengthening relationships and communication with new and longtime stakeholders. When combined with a prudent financial model, we are positioning Pinewood for a strong future.

#### **KEY POINTS INCLUDE:**

- Ensuring that everyone at Pinewood feels visible, valued, and respected as part of our expanding diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives.
- Investing in more professional development opportunities for Pinewood's award-winning faculty and staff.
- Supporting expansion of the Parent Teacher Organization (PTO), Panther Athletic Club (PAC), Friends of Pinewood, volunteer opportunities, and family events to foster engagement.
- Strengthening connections with alumni through events and communication, while showcasing alumni achievement to new and prospective Pinewood families.
- Developing broader opportunities and investments in the student experience, including clubs, community service, internships, college visits, and research.
- Establishing an independent endowment to safeguard our long-term financial security.

- Pinewood is the alma mater of more than 1,300 alumni.
- Nearly \$2 million raised in Pinewood's largest capital campaign in school history, toward construction of a brand-new athletic facility.
- Named "Best Place to Work," "Best Private School," "Best After-School Program" and "Best Daycare" by local media.
- More than 33% of students receive financial aid to ensure Pinewood is affordable for every family.
- In 2021, Pinewood hosted its first Giving Day and raised over \$150,000 for the Annual Fund.

Placed in an open glass holder that reads,


"Character is everything."
